

Declaration on destruction of confidential data for scientific purposes

I, (name and surname(s), position, institution), as principal investigator, having had access to confidential data file(s) for the purpose of [name of research project],

HEREBY DECLARE:

That on dd/mm/20.... I received from the Statistical Institute of Catalonia (hereinafter Idescat) a file or files containing confidential data for scientific purposes, for which I previously signed a declaration of commitment for access to confidential data for scientific purposes on dd/mm/20....

That after using the confidential data provided by Idescat to carry out the aforementioned research, these data have been completely destroyed, in all their material mediums and including any partial or total copy, in accordance with point 9 of the previously signed declaration.

That if, as the research project's head researcher, I fail to comply with the obligations established in the previously signed declaration of commitment, I will be subject to the penalties the Law establishes in each case and that Idescat will have the right to demand such penalties, in accordance with the legally established procedures.
